PROJECT AREA
The TOD redevelopment area encompasses a four block area located between State and Mulberry Streets, Cameron Street, and the train tracks. Of particular interest for the study is the former U.S. Postal Service building, a large underutilized site located on Market Street. At the conclusion of the planning process, the study will provide different scenarios that may be advanced for implementation to promote redevelopment, business attraction, and connectivity to the train station and adjacent neighborhoods.

Four days of exciting opportunities to participate in creating a vibrant transit-oriented center!

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT), in partnership with the City of Harrisburg and the Harrisburg Redevelopment Authority, is embarking on an exciting transit-oriented development (TOD) concept study to redevelop the Harrisburg Transportation Center (HTC) and surrounding Market Street corridor as a vibrant, transit-oriented center. The study will promote the reuse and redevelopment of adjacent parcels, walkability and accessibility enhancements, sense of place, and overall economic development.

The HTC, also known as the Harrisburg Train Station, is the western terminal point for all but two of the 28 Amtrak trains that serve the station each day. The service currently attracts more than 1.6 million riders each year and serves as a connection point for the intercity and local buses that also stop at the station. As noted by Governor Tom Wolf, "Enhancing Pennsylvania's transportation infrastructure is essential to the region's economy . . . State government calls Harrisburg home and we want to partner with the city where possible to improve the quality of life for its residents and businesses."

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 19

6:00 pm – 8:00 pm Community Workshop: Introduction & Visioning

Join us for an introductory workshop to learn more about the Harrisburg TOD Concept Study. The workshop will serve as a kick-off event for Visioning Week, and the Project Team will provide a presentation outlining the study's purpose, objectives, and approach. Attendees will have the opportunity to engage in a variety of interactive exercises to identify the assets and opportunities of the HTC TOD redevelopment area.

Definition: Transit-oriented development, or TOD, is a type of community development that can include a mixture of housing, office, retail and/or other amenities located near public transportation.

8:00 pm – 9:30 pm TOD Film Fest

Visioning Week will harness the visual power of film as an engaging outreach event that helps people 'see' and share the experiences of those who have addressed similar TOD issues. Our opening day screening of short films will showcase the best films most relevant to the issues facing Harrisburg from all over the world.

The New Urbanism Film Festival is an annual four-day event that takes place in Hollywood every fall. The festival screens short and feature length films on the topic of the built environment. Founded in 2013 as a way to take the conversation about urban planning beyond the classroom, out of the council chambers, and on to the silver screen, the festival has traveled the world, hosting smaller-scale screenings in Austin, Buffalo, Dallas, Detroit, Fresno, Milan, Olympia, Oxnard, Salt Lake City, Shenzhen, Stockholm, and Venice.
